Directions for Obtaining State License (AEMT or Paramedic)

Bring in ENTIRE packet from National Registry → Gail

letter with card attached + certificate will be scanned into your training file

For state license (process has changed, done mostly online):

- Go to Georgia Department of Public Health website: dph.georgia.gov
- Click on Programs / Health Protection / EMS Personnel Licensure / LMS Account Creation for New Personnel
- Go to <u>www.mygemsis.org/lms</u> and follow directions.
- Print off receipt and bring with you to fingerprint location. KEEP RECEIPT.
- Purchase money order or cashier's check for \$75 for your state license, payable to "GEORGIA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH." KEEP RECEIPT.
- Bring in your driver's license and the Verification of Lawful U.S. Residency form. Ask for Shelia to notarize the form (sign form in front of her).

Reimbursement: (For EMT written ONLY plus AEMT written and state license):

- Go to Station Forms find nontravel reimbursement form
 - info must be TYPED
 - Enter COMPLETE home address (including zip code) and a phone #
 - Leave 'Account for Reimbursement' line empty
 - o Date of Claim: date you fill out the form
 - o Reimbursement description:
 - National Registry EMT written exam (after passing): \$80*
 - National Registry AEMT written exam (after passing): \$115*
 - Fingerprint background: \$48.25*
 - State AEMT license: \$75*
 - Attach receipt for each of these items (*future costs may change)
- Per Chief Sweat, all receipts must be submitted at the same time.
- Print off and sign reimbursement form submit all paperwork to Gail.

BEFORE you get your state license: You CANNOT practice as an AEMT (or paramedic) until you have your actual physical State of Georgia license. Don't forget - you must complete the mentorship program before you can be released.

AFTER you get your state license: Email Gail BOTH the LETTER and license

- to be scanned into your training file
- to be copied for your personnel file and to start paperwork for pay increase
- You MUST have your state license on you at all times when on duty.
